**CHRIS AND THIS PAST CHRISTMAS....
and BEYOND**

“Chris” called one afternoon late last summer asking simply for a ride to a homeless shelter in Minneapolis for him, his wife, and two small children. Chris told Pastor that he had been a driver several years with UPS and now after being unemployed for many months they had lost their home too. Pastor took them to their destination, only a few blocks from the Metro Dome to which throngs of people with funds for entertainment beyond daily necessities were on their way to a Twins’ game. Pastor helped them unload the possessions they had with them, and finding that the shelter could not accommodate all they had, he brought some things back to the parsonage garage. After a few short phone contacts with the family early on, all contact was lost. Pastor wondered if they ever would recover their few meager possessions he had in the garage. He wanted to believe Chris’ story, but we have been burned so many times by other pleas from panhandlers.

The day after Christmas (a Saturday) Chris called and said that his mother had been in a car accident as she approached her daughter’s home near Atlanta for the holiday. She was not doing well in the hospital, and Chris asked Pastor to loan him money for an airplane ticket so he could see her before she possibly died. Chris said he was getting his first check from a new job on Monday, and he promised he would pay Pastor back promptly. Well, Pastor didn’t feel comfortable floating that particular loan..... a likely story!

Turns out, the Monday after Christmas Chris used his first check to get his car back from the repair man who had been holding it since August for a transmission job the car required. Leaving his family here, Chris took off for Atlanta, where he found his mother had died hours before his arrival. Chris and his family are getting resettled in Champlin and the kids are in school. On top of his regular job, Chris has landed part time work as a game time grounds keeper for the Twins’ this summer. He and his wife are so grateful to the homeless shelter that they plan to do volunteer work there in the months ahead. We wish him and his family richest blessings. Pastor is most happy for them....and miserable that he did not loan Chris the money for the airplane.

Pray that we have not seen the last of Chris!

Brooklyn Bridge is about a dozen short of full capacity (4 classes x 12 students = 48). While we started out the year with good numbers, it seems the weak economy is catching up with many young families. Business cards are being made available this morning for members to join Pastor in handing them out to parents with small children at stores, on the street, and at work. The unschooled children are out there. Pastor learned recently that 248 families are on a Brooklyn Park waiting list for Head Start. Both Miss Koch and Pastor's vehicles are carrying door signs promoting our school.

Congregation participation in the **Scrip Program** is all the more important to cover BBS costs, especially in view of Thrivent cutting their matching gifts program this year. The congregation has no funds in the lean 2010 budget to subsidize the outreach with the saving Gospel to these precious little souls.

The Ladies Guild meeting for February has been changed to Monday, February 1 due to Drivers Improvement Class.

The cost is only \$24. Those BLC members and friends who have already taken the course can attend the three year mandatory refresher at BLC on Thursday, February 25th, for \$20. Register by calling 1-888-234-1294. There will be publicity put out in our community. Pray that this can be a conduit in helping us reach out to neighbors with "insurance" for eternity in Christ. There is a class size limit of about 30. Seven were signed up as of a week ago.
